

1 **CHAPTER 807. CAREER SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES**

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3 **ADOPTED RULES WITH PREAMBLE TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE TEXAS**
4 **REGISTER. THIS DOCUMENT WILL HAVE NO SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES BUT IS**
5 **SUBJECT TO FORMATTING CHANGES AS REQUIRED BY THE TEXAS REGISTER.**

7 The Texas Workforce Commission (Commission) adopts the following new section to Chapter
8 807, relating to Career Schools and Colleges, *without changes*, as published in the June 22, 2007,
9 issue of the *Texas Register* (32 TexReg 3840):

24 **PART I. PURPOSE, BACKGROUND, AND AUTHORITY**
25

26 The purpose of new §807.7, Exemptions, is to set forth a procedure for the Commission to grant
27 exemptions and hear appeals regarding denied exemptions from the requirement for a certificate
28 of approval. Texas Education Code, Chapter 132, provides a list of schools and courses of
29 instruction that may be exempted from the requirements of the Texas Education Code and do not
30 require a certificate of approval. The statute requires a school to apply to the Commission for
31 approval of such an exemption. The new rule establishes a procedure for approving, denying, or
32 revoking exemptions. In addition, the new rule sets forth a procedure for appealing the denial or
33 revocation of an exemption in the same manner as the denial or revocation of a certificate of
34 approval.
35

36 The purpose of amending §807.152 is to more closely track Texas Education Code, Chapter 132,
37 and the flexibility it provides the Commission with regard to the range of renewal fees collected
38 annually from career schools and colleges for purposes of program administration.
39

40 Currently, renewal fees are assessed by applying a percentage to the gross tuition and fees,
41 excluding refunds, of a career school or college. Texas Education Code §132.201 provides that
42 renewal fees may be set by the Commission in an amount "not to exceed 150 percent" of an
43 amount that is determined by applying a percentage "not to exceed" 0.3%. The rule in its present
44 form does not provide this full range of options and, as such, is more restrictive than the statute.
45

1 In adapting to circumstances, as currently, where the Commission may otherwise collect more in
2 fees than necessary to administer Texas Education Code, Chapter 132; amending §807.152 to
3 allow the Commission to annually establish the renewal fee percentage will provide the
4 Commission flexibility in adapting to changing circumstances. The Commission anticipates that
5 the result of this rule amendment, in the near term, will be a lower fee for many schools. Schools
6 currently assessed the minimum fee will not see a reduction as the minimum does not change.

7
8 Conversely, by mirroring the provisions of Texas Education Code §132.201, the Commission
9 will have the full range of rate-setting mechanisms to address any increased need for fee income.
10 This change ensures that the collection of renewal fees for certification of career schools and
11 colleges is appropriately set to sufficiently cover the costs of administering the chapter.

12 13 **PART II. EXPLANATION OF INDIVIDUAL PROVISIONS WITH COMMENTS AND** 14 **RESPONSES**

15 16 **SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

17 **The Commission adopts the following amendments to Subchapter A:**

18 **§807.7. Exemptions**

19
20 New §807.7(a) provides that a school or educational institution may apply to the Commission for
21 an exemption under §132.002 or §132.003 of the Texas Education Code.

22
23 New §807.7(b) provides that the Commission must grant the requested exemption if the
24 Commission determines that the school or educational institution meets the statutory
25 requirements for an exemption under §132.002 or §132.003 of the Texas Education Code.

26
27 New §807.7(c) provides that the Commission may deny or revoke an exemption in the same
28 manner as a denial or revocation of a certificate of approval, if the Commission determines that
29 the school or educational institution does not meet the requirements for the exemption under
30 §132.002 or §132.003 of the Texas Education Code.

31
32 New §807.7(d) provides that a school or educational institution may appeal the denial or
33 revocation of an exemption in the same manner as for appealing the denial or revocation of a
34 certificate of approval.

35 36 **SUBCHAPTER I. APPLICATION FEES AND OTHER CHARGES**

37 **The Commission adopts the following amendments to Subchapter I:**

38 39 **§807.152. Renewal Fees**

40 Section 807.152 is amended to annually establish the renewal fee percentage, which will provide
41 the Commission flexibility in ensuring that the collection of renewal fees for certification of
42 career schools and colleges is in balance with the cost of administering Chapter 132 of the Texas
43 Education Code. In adapting to circumstances, as currently, where the Commission may
44 otherwise collect more in fees than necessary to administer Texas Education Code, Chapter 132,
45 enactment of this amendment is anticipated, in the near term, to allow the Commission to lower
46 the fees currently collected and more appropriately fund the program's administration.

1
2 **Comment:** The commenter agreed with establishing an annual renewal fee percentage
3 affording the Agency flexibility in setting future renewal fees—including but not limited to
4 lowering fees for many schools. However, the commenter stated that overages in collected
5 fees should be appropriated and spent to better administer Texas Education Code, Chapter
6 132. The commenter also expressed concern in processing and disseminating certificates of
7 renewal, representative approvals, new program (and other) applications, and addressing
8 unlicensed school violations are not timely due to the limited number of staff. The
9 commenter asked that the Agency be tasked with collecting enough fees to increase
10 appropriations and spending the full measure of those appropriated dollars to better
11 administer Texas Education Code, Chapter 132, by adding additional staff to the Career
12 Schools and Colleges program.
13

14 **Response:** The Commission appreciates the commenter's support of an annual renewal fee
15 that allows the Commission flexibility to adapt to changing circumstances. By amending
16 §807.152 to establish an annual renewal fee rate, the Commission's intent is to avoid the
17 overcollection of funds necessary to administer the Career Schools and Colleges program in
18 order to provide appropriate services. The Commission believes the rule clearly sets forth a
19 process that ensures the collection of renewal fees in balance with the cost of adequately
20 administering Chapter 132. Further, the Commission recognizes the importance that staff
21 plays in the ongoing success of the program. Staff makes every attempt at processing and
22 disseminating all information in a timely manner. The Commission notes that the 80th Texas
23 Legislature, Regular Session (2007) approved its Exceptional Item Appropriation request of
24 General Revenue funding for the Fiscal Year 2008–2009 biennium, thereby increasing
25 appropriations for two additional full-time equivalents for the Career Schools and Colleges
26 program.

10 that the school or educational institution meets the requirements for an exemption
11 under §132.002 or §132.003 of the Texas Education Code.

- 13 (c) The Commission may deny or revoke an exemption in the same manner as a denial
14 or revocation of a certificate of approval, if the Commission determines that the
15 school or educational institution does not meet the requirements for the exemption
16 under §132.002 or §132.003 of the Texas Education Code.
- 17
- 18 (d) A school or educational institution may appeal the denial or revocation of an
19 exemption in accordance with the provisions of Subchapter D of the Texas
20 Education Code.

22 **SUBCHAPTER I. APPLICATION FEES AND OTHER CHARGES**

23 **§807.152. Renewal Fees.**

- 24 (a) For small schools, if a certificate of approval is issued for more than one year, the
25 renewal fee is \$1,001, which may be paid with \$501 the first year and \$250 on the
26 anniversary date of the certificate for each subsequent year.
- 27
- 28 (b) For all other schools, the renewal fee is based on the gross amount minus refunds of
29 annual student tuition and fees. The Commission will establish the renewal fee on an
30 annual basis, based upon the cost of administration of the chapter. The renewal fee
31 will be set in accordance with the provisions of §132.201 of the Texas Education
32 Code.

- 34 (c) For all schools, the Commission shall assess a penalty of 10% of the renewal fee, not
35 less than \$200 or more than \$1,000, if the school fails to file a complete application
36 for renewal at least 30 days before the expiration date of the certificate of approval.
- 37
