Criteria	WIA Exemplary Award
1	A Board: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • must achieve at least a cumulative 100 percent program score for each of the program performance areas (excluding Average Earnings); and • must not have any of the individual WIA performance measures fall below 90 percent of its adjusted performance targets.
2	A Board must meet or exceed at least an 80 percent expenditure rate for each WIA funding stream.
3	A Board must achieve a minimum 60 percent expenditure rate for out-of-school youth.
4	A Board must meet the expenditure targets for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds, as established by the Commission:
	Youth Funds:
	70 percent—expended by September 30, 2009
	80 percent—expended within the first program year of availability (January 31, 2010)
	100 percent—expended by the contract end date (June 30, 2010)
	Adult and Dislocated Worker:
	80 percent—expended within the first program year of availability (June 30, 2010)
