Notes:

- 1 At least 80 percent of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Employment and Training (SNAP E&T) funds available to the Commission are allocated to the workforce areas using a need-based formula, in order to meet state and federal requirements, on the basis of the relative proportion of the total unduplicated number of mandatory work registrants receiving SNAP benefits residing within the workforce area during the most recent calendar year to the statewide total number of unduplicated mandatory work registrants receiving SNAP benefits, an equal base amount, and application of a hold harmless/stop gain procedure. [TWC Rules §800.54(b)]
- 2 Includes \$850,940 in amounts for SNAP E&T transportation services, which were formerly included in separate transportation service contracts, but excluded from SNAP E&T allocations.
- 3 Texas's proportion of an estimated \$20 million in national funding to serve only able-bodied adults without dependents (ABAWDs) is customarily made available by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service after the beginning of the program year. When the program year block grant allocations are adopted, planning estimates are provided to Boards regarding this ABAWD-Only funding, based on the best information that is available at the time. After ABAWD-Only funding is received, it is allocated as a supplemental allocation to workforce areas, in the same proportion as the original allocations for that program year.
- 4 Planning estimates approved by the Texas Workforce Commission on August 24, 2010.
- 5 TWC was notified by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service, on December 8, 2010, of the FY 2011 federal grant allocation amounts to provide education, training, and other workforce services in the SNAP E&T program only for ABAWDs. The amount to Texas totals \$5,494,505.
- 6 The TWC block grant allocations for FY 2011, adopted on August 24, 2010, included a notation on the summary sheet that SNAP E&T ABAWD-Only funds to be received later in the program year would be made available at that time to workforce areas as a supplemental allocation.
