Discussion Paper –Funding Request for COVID-19 Skills Grants

2 Background

- 3 At the April 14, 2020 meeting, Commissioners approved a series of funding recommendations
- 4 including up to \$10 million in Skills Development Funds (SDF) to support training in high
- 5 demand occupations with priority given to training in the healthcare, manufacturing, and IT
- 6 sectors retooling business processes in direct response to needs identified by COVID-19.

- 8 To date, 50 grants have been awarded totaling \$9,947,500 across a variety of sectors. These
- 9 grants are projected to train 5,326 workers, with 1,006 workers currently in training, and 743
- workers already trained since these grants began in early May. A new streamlined application
- was introduced as part of this process and it has been successful in getting training started
- 12 quickly for business partners with critical and time sensitive training needs.

Issue

- 15 In the last two weeks, three new applications for funding have been received, and six active
- 16 grants are requesting additional funds to meet training demand, pushing the amount of funding
- 17 needed in excess of the \$10 million approved on April 14.
- 18 Due to the success of these grants and the ongoing need for COVID-19 training for employers,
- 19 staff are seeking additional funds in support of this special initiative. We estimate that at least
- 20 2,500 additional workers will be trained with these additional funds, and the requirement for
- 21 training to begin within 30 days of grant award remains in effect.

22 **Decision**

- 23 Staff seek Commission approval for up to \$5 million for use across FY2020 and FY 2021 Skills
- 24 Development Fund (SDF) funds for COVID-19 Skills grants.
