21 22 22 22 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 33 33 34 35 36 37 38 38	For consideration—Statewide High School Equivalency Virtual Provider (AEL State Leadership Funds) Approximately 3 million adult Texans lack a high school diploma or its equivalent, and pandemic unemployment insurance claimant data during March 2020—June 2021 shows that more than half a million claimants lack a high school diploma or its equivalent. Although current AEL grantees provide high school equivalency (HSE) preparation as a service, TWC staff has identified a need for additional support in the provision of HSE instruction in order to have a wider reach to an AEL-eligible population that may not be currently accessing AEL program resources and to support attainment of a Texas certificate of high school equivalency (TxCHSE). Staff proposes funding a statewide virtual provider initiative to provide HSE preparation instruction and support for the purpose of TxCHSE attainment and transition into postsecondary education or training. This initiative: • supports House Bill 1525 from the 87th Texas Legislature, Regular Session (2021), which continues the TWC HSE subsidy program originally passed in the previous legislative session; • further supports efforts to make AEL services available in a variety of formats; and • strives to reach new participants who are currently not able to participate in traditional AEL settings.
